4. Taking a job on the group level, i.e., Bookie, GSR, Treasurer, Secretary
5. Taking a job on the District level, i.e., Committee Chair, or serving on a district committee or as a District Officer
6. Same as District ,but on the Area level.

So how do you serve? The question is what talents or skills do you have? Where can your service be of most good? The next question is how do I find out? That answer is easy. It's just to ask. The answer can be found in the wisdom of a person already serving in that position, in a sponsor's wisdom or in a District/ Area handbook.

So as elections approach give consideration in how can I be of service and step up to plate. It will be good for you and someone else.


