"... to be willing to share things that happened to me and the emotions that I had when I first came into the fellowship. To try to explain to another alcoholic the feelings I had that allowed me to stay and not drink a day at a time."

"...to carry the message to the newcomer."

"...to give what has been given to me – I have to pass on the spirit of service to my sponsees."

"... to give the gift which was so freely given to me, back to the alcoholic who still suffers."

"...to give to anyone who asks for help what was so generously given to me for so many years. To be ready to give service whenever there is a need. To be willing to share with anyone who has a need or interest in the program."

"...sharing my experience, strength and hope when requested."

...to keep AA alive, share my story, reach out a hand– when I need help and someone else needs help. Live and learn the steps, traditions, concepts and to be human.

"...showing outsiders and newcomers by example my experience, strength and hope in their quest to develop the serenity they deserve."

"... showing love and welcoming anyone who walks into our doors. Making them feel comfortable so they will want to keep coming and ask for sponsorship. Passing it on when in the sponsorship role means walking the sponsee through the steps and the Big Book and being there for them through anything while also taking care of yourself."

"...to try to work with all recovering alcoholics by welcoming them to meetings, and helping with sponsorship and the steps as well as service work. Basically I try to set a proper example."

"...to walk my talk – make it a point at every meeting to hold my hand out and welcome the newcomer. Share the message and how the program works."

"Pass It On" is the theme for the NH Area 43 45th Annual Convention being held at the North Conway Grand Hotel April 8-10th, 2011.
